Twenty20 Match Playing Conditions

- 1) These rules and bye – laws cover the tournament mentioned above and shall be read in conjunction with the rules and bye – laws of CCA.
- 2) Except as varied hereunder the laws of cricket **2000** code (**2003 Edition**) shall apply.
- 3) The match shall consist of one inning per side and shall be limited to 20 six balls over, the same to be completed in One Hour Twenty Minutes with no water breaks.

Change 3:20 pm to 3:40 pm
Second Innings 3:40 pm to 5:00 pm

First Innings 10:00 am to 11:20 am
Change 11:20 am to 11:40 am
Second Innings 11:40 am to 01:00 pm

LUNCH BREAK 01.00 PM – 1.45PM

First Innings 1:45 pm to 3:05 pm
Change 3:05 pm to 3:25 pm
Second Innings 3:25 pm to 4:45 pm
- 5) No bowler may bowl more than four overs.
- 6) The overs shall be reduced or game abandoned due to adverse conditions, six points plus any bonus points earned shall be credit to both sides.
 - a) Save for the circumstances where a match is awarded to a team as a consequence of the opposing teams refusal of play (Law 21.3) a result can be achieved only if both teams have had the opportunity of batting for at least 5 overs, unless one team has been all out in less than 5 overs or unless the team batting second scores enough runs to win in less than 5 overs.



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- b) Save for the circumstances where a match is awarded to a team as a consequence of the opposing team's refusal of play (Law 21.3) all matches in which both teams have not had an opportunity of batting for a minimum of 5 overs, shall be declared no result
- 7) During the Fielding Restriction Overs only two fieldsmen shall be permitted outside this fielding restriction area at the instant of deliver. Fielding restriction shall apply to first 6 overs of each innings
- 8) For the remaining overs not more than five fielders shall be permitted outside the Field Restriction Area.

POWER PLAY OVERS SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS

- 9) Game points:
- (i) Win – 12 points
 - (ii) Bonus points:
 - a) Batting – 1 point each for reaching 125, 150, 175 and 200 maximum of 4 points.
 - b) Bowling – 1 point each for 3, 5, 7, 10 wickets, maximum 4 points.
 - c) If the side batting first is bowled out for less than 100 runs, the fielding side shall get extra 2 bonus points in addition to the points earned for that particular match, provided they win the match.
 - (iii) Abandoned – Owing to rain or bad light 6 points each plus bonus points earned at the time of abandonment
- 10) **Free Hit after a foot-fault no ball**

In addition to the above, the delivery following a NO BALL for a foot fault shall be a free hit for whichever batsman is facing it. If



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the delivery for the free hit is not a legitimate delivery (any kind of NO BALL or WIDE BALL), than the next delivery will become a free hit for whichever batsman is facing it.

For any free hit, the striker can be dismissed only under circumstances that apply for a NO BALL, even if the delivery for the free hit is called a wide ball.

Field changes are not permitted for free hit deliveries unless there is a change of striker.

- ❖ Prematurely Terminated Matches – Calculation of the target score
- Interrupted Matches – Calculation of the Target Score
 - a) if, due to suspension of play after the start of the match, the numbers of overs in the innings of either team has to be revised to a lesser number than the original allotted (minimum of 5 overs, than a revised target score (to win) should be set for the number of overs which the team batting second will have the opportunity of facing. This revised target is to be calculated using the current (Duckworth/Lewis) D/L method. The target set will always be a whole number and one run less will constitute a tie.
- Prematurely Terminated Matches
 - b) If the innings of the side batting second is suspended (with at least 5 overs bowled) and it is not possible for the match to be resumed, the match will be decided by comparison with the D/L 'Par Score' determined at the instant of the suspension by the D/L method. If the score is equal to the par score the match is a Tie. Otherwise the result is a victory or defeat, by the margin of runs by which the score exceeds, or falls short of the Par Score.

Where as in case of Knockout matches, the match shall be re-scheduled.

- i) In the event of a tied match the teams shall complete in a one over per side eliminator to determine the winner. Refer attached **Appendix 8**.



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PENALTIES

- a) The fielding side must bowl an average of fifteen overs per hour. The batting side must avoid unnecessary delay in the progress of the match. If the umpires suspect that either side have, during the course of the match, resorted to deliberate delaying tactics, they will report this in writing to the Executive Committee who shall be entitled to take such disciplinary action as they may deem appropriate or necessary.
- b) The outgoing and the incoming batsmen must cross each other on the field of play.
- c) There shall be no consultation between the batsmen during the course of an over. However, the batsmen may consult each other at the end of an over with the permission of either umpire.
- d) If the team fielding first fails to bowl the required number of overs by the scheduled time for cessation of the first innings, play shall continue until the required number of overs has been bowled.
- e) If the team batting first is dismissed in less than 20 overs, the team batting second shall be entitled to bat for 20 overs.
- f) If the team fielding second fails to bowl 20 overs by the scheduled cessation time, the hours of play shall be extended until the required number of overs has been bowled or a result is achieved.
- g) Penalties shall apply for slow over rates as follows:
 - i. One point shall be deducted from every over under bowled by the schedule time for cessation of the innings.**
- h) Any injured player shall be removed immediately from the ground. Treatment is to be provided off the field.
